CALL TO ORDER

Chairman Sparks welcomed everyone and called the Technical Advisory Committee meeting to order at 10:02 a.m. Introductions were made around the room.

PUBLIC COMMENT

None at this time.

A. APPROVE THE SEPTEMBER 3, 2025 MEETING MINUTES

Chairman Sparks asked that the September Technical Advisory Committee meeting minutes be approved.

Bill Killingsworth moved to approve the September 3, 2025 meeting minutes; Doug Conkey seconded; motion unanimously carried.

**B. FDOT REQUESTS AMENDING THE FY 2025/26 – FY 2029/30
TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM (TIP)**

Reuben Franklin moved to approve the FDOT's request to amend the FY 2025/26 – FY 2029/30 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP); Bill Killingsworth seconded; motion unanimously carried.

C. RESOLUTION ADOPTING 2026 SAFETY PERFORMANCE TARGETS

Clark Letter informed the group the Federal Highway Administration (FHA) published several rules establishing performance measures and reporting requirements for State Departments of Transportation (DOTs) and Metropolitan Planning Organizations (MPOs). These rules establish measures to assess the condition of road safety within MPO boundaries.

FDOT annually establishes statewide safety targets for the following calendar year as part of the HSIP Annual Report, which must be submitted by August 31 each year. Targets are applicable to all public roads regardless of functional classification or ownership.

MPOs have the option of supporting the statewide targets or establishing their own targets for the MPO planning area. MPOs must set their targets within 180 days after FDOT sets the statewide targets. MPOs must annually update their targets by February 27 of each year.

Mr. Letter asked for questions.

- Doug Conkey commented he would like to see a more realistic goal. Zero is not realistic.

Mr. Letter responded that every year the TPO produces an Annual Mobility Report where we track our performance over a five-year period. We will have a presentation on this before the end of the year.

- Elizabeth Backe fully supports the aspirational goal of zero.
- Chairman Sparks commented he also supports this goal.

- Michael Grunewald asked if the TPO or FDOT puts out crash data for each county.

Mr. Letter responded both the TPO and FDOT published that information. It is located on the TPO website and in FDOT's source book.

- Michael Grunewald would like the ability to sort the data by state and federal routes and separate it from county and municipal routes.

Elizabeth Backe moved to approve the 2026 Safety Performance Targets; Reuben Franklin seconded; motion unanimously carried.

D. BEST FOOT FORWARD PROGRAM LAUNCH

Thalia Fuste presented the Best Foot Forward program that will be done by Bike/Walk Central Florida.

Ms. Fuste asked for questions.

- Laurie Santana asked if funding is available to implement the recommendations from the task force.

Ms. Fuste responded we will be looking for funding.

- Mr. Sheffield commented we are looking to see how this program operates and if it is effective. If we see positive results, we can then move forward with the funding piece.
- Doug Conkey commented we need to ensure traffic cameras are in place so we can see what causes these issues.
- Michael Grunewald asked what the TPO's expectation of this pilot is. Mr. Grunewald stated the RFB has a yellow flashing light, which is not an indication to the driver that he must stop.

Ms. Fuste responded drivers must yield to a pedestrian in the crosswalk.

- Chris LeDew commented it is state law for a driver to stop for a pedestrian in the crosswalk. The yellow flashing light is to alert the driver a pedestrian is nearby. The driver has the responsibility to stop for a pedestrian in the crosswalk and the pedestrian has the responsibility not to step in front of a car traveling at a speed that it cannot safely stop. It is a judgement call for police officers to determine who is at fault.

We have found the RFBs are not working well for higher speeds. We are having many problems with this. The City is aware of several crossings that we are trying to upgrade from an RFB to a Hawk signal.

E. SR 105 (HECKSCHER DRIVE) CORRIDOR STUDY PRESENTATION

Ms. Moore asked for questions. There were no questions at this time.

Subject: **Annual List of Priority Projects**

Staff is soliciting projects for the annual List of Priority Projects (LOPP). This is a candidate list of projects for the new fifth year of the Florida Department of Transportation's Five Year Work Program. Please submit your initial priority projects no later than **January 23, 2026**. We understand that formal approval by your county commission or city council may take longer, but this request will enable TPO staff to prepare a first draft of the LOPP for the February round of committee and Board meetings. Our expectation will be to adopt the LOPP in March.

The LOPP document includes the following categories of projects:

- **Region-Wide Priority Projects – Transportation Capacity Projects**
This list is perhaps the most important. This list of 25 projects represents the larger capacity and high priority projects throughout the TPO area. This list does not change substantially from year to year, as projects are typically only removed from the list when construction funding has been programmed.
- **Aviation Priority Projects**
Jacksonville Aviation Authority and St. Augustine - St. Johns County Airport Authority can each submit a list of its priorities for inclusion in the document. The TPO includes these as a reference, but does not re-prioritize these projects.
- **Mass Transit Priorities**
Jacksonville Transportation Authority and St. Johns/Sunshine Bus can each submit a list of its priorities for inclusion in the document. The TPO includes these as a reference, but does not re-prioritize these projects.
- **Port Priority Projects**
JAXPORT and the Ocean Highway & Port Authority of Nassau County can each submit a list of its priorities for inclusion in the document. The TPO includes these as a reference, but does not re-prioritize these projects.

- **Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP) – Multi-Use Trails or Sidewalks**
TAP projects are funded on a rotational basis by County. Our estimated total TAP funding of \$3M will be split to fund two different Counties at approximately \$1.5M each. We are asking that each county please submit two TAP projects to provide a backup in case any issues arise with the first project submission.
- **SUN Trail Program – Multi-Use Trails**
It is especially critical that each county submit one viable project for each of the TAP and SUN Trail Programs. Cost estimates must be provided. It is recommended you revisit the project submitted annually to ensure it is still feasible. Applications must be submitted through the GAP system. Please submit the entire trail to our list broken into fundable segments, and indicate the priority of each segment.
- **Transportation Regional Incentive Program Priorities**
Transportation Regional Incentives Program (TRIP) priorities reflect the region-wide priority list.

Again, please submit your initial priority projects no later than **January 23, 2026**.

Subject: Request for Study Suggestions - FY 2026/27

The North Florida TPO and the Florida Department of Transportation are seeking study requests for the 2026/27 fiscal year. The Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP) is the North Florida Transportation Planning Organization's (TPO's) two-year task-based budget. Bi-annually, the staff of the TPO updates the UPWP as required by state and federal regulations. The UPWP outlines all major transportation planning activities undertaken by the TPO for the two-year planning period beginning July 1, 2024 and ending June 30, 2026.

The North Florida TPO is requesting studies to consider for inclusion in Fiscal Year 2026/27. These projects will be located in **Section 5 – Special Projects** section of the UPWP, and are executed by a TPO General Consultant.

Studies submissions will also be considered by FDOT District 2 staff for selection. These studies will be performed by FDOT and supporting consultant staff in coordination with the TPO.
